July 4, 1776 – Happy Birthday America

The American Revolution was a war between the 13 British Colonies in North America and Great Britain. It lasted from **April 19, 1775, to Sept. 3, 1783**, a little over 8 years, and resulted in independence for the colonies. Can you name the 13 colonies?


By comparison, the Civil War was 4 years, World War I was 6 years, World War II was 4 years, and the Vietnam War was 10 years (1955-1975). Let's honor those who fought and defended freedom.

Blessed are they who make it known, that I am loved, respected and not alone.


And blessed are they who will ease the days, of my journey home, in loving ways.



When in the Lord's great landing net and peacefully asleep, that in His mercy






Thank you to our "Spring Spruce Up" Volunteers
