Parking Particulars! – A Reminder

The Board has received some complaints and concerns from residents who have building areas with a 2-slot parking turn-around. Please do not use these parking spots for resident parking on a daily basis. As our Handbook states, under Parking Restrictions: "Strictly prohibited in turn-around areas. Vehicles parked in the turnarounds are subject to be towed." The turn-around spaces are intended to facillitate turning around in a tight area so that individual driveways aren't overused for that purpose by delivery and other vehicles. They may also be used for occasional guest short-term parking.

Utilize your own driveway and garage for regular daily resident parking.

VEGETABLE PLANTS ARE NOT ALLOWED

Page 18 of our Handbook states that "Vegetable plants are not permitted to prevent attracting unwanted wildlife."

We love fresh vegetables. And so do many wild animals. That's why vegetable plants are not permitted in our community. They attract unwanted wildlife and don't always enhance the beauty of our community.



We have received complaints that a few residents are growing vegetables, both in mulched beds and in pots. We don't want to see mature crops destroyed, so the Board is allowing a <u>one-time exception for this season</u>. Enjoy your veggies this year and <u>don't plant them again</u> in the future. Our policy will be enforced going forward.

We were also told that some are growing herbs like basil, etc. It will be hard to enforce this because they grow low to the ground and won't be visible from the street. Please remember the critters also love many of these plants also, so we ask for you not to continue to plant and grow herbs outside, as well.

This notice does not apply to inside plants.

Trying a new approach! Again.... It is hard to keep straight all the activities, but we are doing our best to keep you informed based on what we know is correct at the point the Newsletter for that month is released.

Please note that some activities are scheduled and cancelled at the group activity leaders' discretion, e.g. due to lack of enough attendees or weather. Your best bet is to email, text, or call and confirm with the activity leader if a monthly event is being held or not for that month.

Group activity leaders should also use email, text, or phone calls to keep those they know as "regular participants" or repeat attendees informed as soon as possible if scheduling changes occur.

Some activities in the past (e.g. Euchre & Cocktails nights) were scheduled on an intermittent basis – based on whether enough people could be rounded up to play or attend. The Board does not control these events.

If you want to schedule an activity at the clubhouse or pool area, please check to be sure there isn't a conflict with a regularly scheduled activity, Social Committee events or other commitments the Board has notified the community about (e.g. we are having maintenance work done). If you find that you'd like to schedule the same event repeatedly and be the leader or group activity coordinator for a new activity, please email the CP Board cwp4528@gmail.com of your plan. The Board will review your request and commit to when it can be held. This is not for screening out or stifling ideas for new activities but for facilities coordination, managing the risks for the association, and Board awareness of what is planned.

Road Construction


This is a bi-annual event for maintaining our Roads. More information to come via email announcements.
